Let Us... - Hebrews 10:19-25 October 9, 2016

I. Draw Near (vs. 19-22)

- No longer called to 'stay back' (Exodus 19), we are invited into God's presence.
- We are able to draw near because of what Christ has done as our sacrifice.
- We are able to draw near because of what Christ has done as our high priest.
- Jesus is both our access and our advocate...so we can come confidently (Hebrews 4:16).

III. Stir Up (vs. 24-25)

- We are to 'press our minds' on to others.
- We are to 'stir' one another on...a positive irritant.
- We are to promote love and good works...affection and action.
- The encouragement is in the gathering...
- We gather to do ministry together and to be ministered to together.

Questions/Discovery Points for Life Groups/Families

Please read Hebrews 10:19-25

- 1. Why are we able to draw near to God? What is our confidence rooted in?
- 2. What is the significance of the curtain in this text, and what is the role of the priest?
- 3. What are some Bible verses that encourage you to 'hold fast'?
- 4. How does Christian community help us to 'hold fast'?
- 5. How can you do a better job of considering others, specifically on Sunday morning?
- 6. Can you tell a personal story of when someone had to 'stir' you up? How did you respond?
- 7. In what ways are you encouraged as we gather on Sunday mornings?
- 8. How should the gospel impact your view of other people and the significance of corporate worship?

II. Hold Fast (vs. 23)

- Without wavering and looking to Jesus (Hebrews 12:1-2).
- In full assurance of our hope (Hebrews 3:6; 6:11).
- Hope is the mark of the believer (Ephesians 2:12-13; 1 Peter 1:3-5).
- Pray that our eyes will be open to the hope we have been called to (Ephesians 1:18-20).
- There is an anchor that has gone ahead to guarantee our hope (Hebrews 6:19-20)...Jesus is the 'anchor of the soul'.
