Salvation and the Sword — Luke 2:25-35 December 23, 2018

GREAT EXPECTATIONS

- The coming of Jesus is the culmination of the entire Old Testament.
- Simeon had been told he would not die until he had seen the Messiah.
- As Christians we are eagerly awaiting Christ's Second Advent (Hebrews 9:28; 2 Timothy 4:8; 1 Peter 1:13).

SALVATION HAS COME (2:29-32)

- Salvation has come in the person of Christ.
- Salvation is offered, not earned (Isaiah 9:5-7).

A SHARP SWORD (2:33-35)

- Jesus is a stone on which many will stumble (Isaiah 8:13-14).
- Jesus is a sword (Matthew 10:34) that causes division between people.
- Jesus is a sword that cuts to the heart of the soul.
