# Great Expectations

What Child Is This? Luke 2:1-20 December 22, 2019

### I. THE SETTING

- Luke is presenting a contrast between Caesar Augustus and Jesus.
  - o Augustus was considered deity...Jesus was God.
  - Augustus had been called a messiah...Jesus was the promised messiah.
  - Augustus ruled from the great city of Rome...Jesus was born in tiny Bethlehem.
  - Augustus achieved peace through conquest...Jesus achieves peace through his death.
  - Augustus received the praise of man...Jesus received the praises of angels.
- God was using even mighty Caesar to help fulfill prophecy through the census as Mary and Joseph travelled to Bethlehem where Jesus was to be born (Mic. 5:2).

#### II. THE SHEPHERDS

- The angels announce the birth to lowly shepherds as a fulfillment of scripture (Jer. 33:10-16).
- They serve as an example of the type of people that Jesus came to save (1 Cor. 1:26-30).

#### III. THE SAVIOR

- Fear not...a savior has been born...and he is Christ the Lord. The promised Messiah is here!
- We all need to be saved from sin guilt.
- Jesus brings peace between God and Man.
- Beholding the Savior results in praise and adoration.
