

Judgment & Promise Genesis 3:14-15 March 1, 2020

"...I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

- **Genesis 3:15**

I. THE SERPENT'S JUDGMENT

A - The sin of Adam (vv. 9-11)

B - The sin of Eve (v. 12)

C - The sin of the serpent (v. 13)

C¹ - The judgment on the serpent (vv. 14-15)

B¹ - The judgment on Eve (v. 16)

A¹ - The judgment on Adam (w. 17-19)

- Each curse involves a life function and a relationship. For the serpent, his function of movement is affected as well as his relationship to the woman and her seed (vv. 14-15).
- The serpent is to be subjugated. His "food" will be dust, that which now represents death (v. 14; 3:19; Ps. 72:9; Isa. 49:23; Micah 7:17; Rom. 16:20; Col. 2:13-15).

II. THE LORD'S PROMISE

- Enmity is "put" between the woman and the serpent, his offspring and hers (v. 15; Gen. 4:6; Ex. 1:8-16; Ex. 14; Joshua-Nehemiah; Esther 3; Rev. 12:1-17).
- Who is the seed of the serpent? Collectively, likely all those aligned against the people of God. Singularly and collectively, possibly Antichrist (John 8:39-47; 1 John 2:18, 22, 4:3; 2 John 1:7).
- Who is the seed of the woman? Likely the people of God collectively, and Messiah singularly (Gal. 3:16; Rom. 16:20).
- He (Messiah) will bruise the serpent's head. Salvation through judgment: the skull crushing seed (Num. 24:17-19; 1 Sam. 17; Jer. 23 [see esp. v. 19]; Matt. 3:7-10; Luke 10:17-19, 1 Cor. 15:25).
- "You" (Satan) will bruise his heel (Isa. 53; Matt. 27:46).
- The "protevangelium." The first glimmer of gospel news.

KNOW: A great drama begins in Genesis 3:14-15. Satan's interference in the relationship between God and his people brings brutal consequences, and unimaginable hope.

DO: Trust in Jesus, the great serpent crusher.
