

Goodness and Severity Genesis 3:16-19 March 8, 2020

I. GOD'S BASIS FOR JUDGEMENT

- We do not see sin as wicked as it is because we do not see God as Holy as He is.
- We have tended to create a God in our image (Psalm 50:19-23).
- We tend to desire therapy rather than redemption.
- Holiness is the cry of the angels for eternity (Revelation 4:8).
- Sin is a big deal. In the Bible it is compared to the smell of an open grave (Psalm 5:9); to a snake's poison (Psalm 140:3); to the vomit of a dog and the mire in which a sow wallows (2 Peter 2:22); the monthly impurity of a woman (Ezekiel 36:17), and to prostitution (Ezekiel 16:25, 33).
- God judges sin because his holiness cannot wink at it. His justice is a holy-justice.

II. GOD'S BENEVOLENCE IN JUDGEMENT

- God's love is a holy-love... he only loves holy things.
- God does not destroy Adam and Eve but rather promises that one day their son will crush their enemy.
- They will both still be able to fulfill their creational mandate, but for both of them it will be with difficulty.
- Eve will have pains in childbearing but she will have children.
- Adam will have thorns and thistles, but he will eat.
- Both will die, but not without hope.
- God's world is beautifully broken and this is evidence of both his holiness and his love.
- Let the brokenness of the world remind you of God's gracious judgement and every blessing of God's grace.
