I. CRUCIFIED TO AND FROM THE WORLD

- Our lives and our world matter. We were born into a particular day and age by the decree of God (Acts 17:26-27).
- Who we are matters. Race, ethnicity, socio-economic backgrounds, etc. shape our world (Acts 10:28-29; Eph. 2:11-12; Phil. 3:4-6).
- Who we are in Christ overshadows all things that make us who we once were (Vs. 15; 2 Cor. 5:17-18; Phil. 3:7-11).

II. PEACE AND MERCY

 God's gift to those who know who they are in Christ is the gift of peace and mercy.

> Peace = overcoming the world (John 16:33) Mercy = A desire to love our neighbor as we love ourselves (Matt. 5:43-48)

III. WE ARE THE CIRCUMCISION

• We are, in Christ Jesus, a new nation...a new people (Phil. 3:3).

KNOW: God has made us a new people in Christ. Our new identities should overshadow our old identities, and keep us focused on what God has called us to be in Christ.

DO: Identify and live as a follower of Jesus Christ.
