If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?
- Psalm 11:1-3

### I. WE CAN RETREAT AND HIDE

- God has not called us to run for the hills.
- We are called to go into the world and make disciples (Matthew 28:16-20).

### II. WE CAN RETALIATE AGAINST OUR ENEMIES

- We do not wage war the way the world does (Ephesians 6:10-20).
- We must pray for our enemies (Matthew 5:44).
- This does not mean we do not fight, but we fight differently than the world does.

### III. WE CAN RELINQUISH OUR CALLING

- We have been called out of darkness to proclaim His excellency (1 Peter 2:9-12).
- If we cease to remain distinctive we are good for nothing and must be discarded (Matthew 5:13).

## IV. WE CAN REMEMBER WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE ARE CALLED TO DO

- The church must act as a preservative in a rotting culture.
- The church must act as a light in a dark world.
- We cannot court friendship with the world (James 4:4).
- Are we bold enough to engage?
- We will be hated (John 15:18-19).
