Advent 2020 Jesus: Prophet, Priest, King

Jesus as King Genesis 49:8-12 December 6, 2020

The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet. - Genesis 49:10

I. THE KING IN PROPHECY

- The scepter and ruler's staff: symbols of kingship (Esther 4:11; Ps. 2:9, 45:6)
- God's kingdom: False starts, the reign of David, and then spiritual and physical decline (1 Sam. 13:14, 15:28; Ps. 137:1)
- A coming king ruling over a kingdom that shall know no end (Dan. 2:44; Ps. 45:6; Luke 1:33, 20:18)
- A king arising again from the line of David (2 Sam. 7:16; Luke 1:30 -33; Rom. 15:12)

II. THE KING REVEALED

- In the fullness of time (Mark 1:14-15; Gal. 4:4-5)
- In the Name of the Lord (Luke 19:37-40; John 12:13)
- In the signs of the coming kingdom (Matt. 4:23; Luke 7:21-22, 11:19-20)
- In direct declarations (Matt. 2:2; Luke 23:3, 42; Acts 17:7)

III. JESUS AS KING

- A spiritual kingdom now, a literal kingdom then (John 8:23, 18:36; Rom. 14:11; Phil. 2:5-11; Rev. 19:11-16)
- A king with expectations (Psalm 2; John 3:16-18; Rom. 11:22)
- Our future in Jesus' kingdom (Eph. 2:6; 2 Tim. 2:12; Rev. 3:21, 22:5)

KNOW: Jesus' role as king makes him our sovereign Lord. As subjects in his kingdom, we are called to obedience. As those who will co-reign with him, we are called to faithfulness and steadfastness. Our hope lies not only in a baby in a manger, but in the King of kings and Lord of lords.

DO: Submit to your king.
