# The Birth of a Nation A Study in Genesis 25-36

A Passing Generation Genesis 25:1-18 January 31, 2021

Abraham breathed his last and died in a good old age, an old man and full of years, and was gathered to his people.

-Genesis 25:8

#### I. A FATHER OF MANY NATIONS (VSS. 1-6; 12-18)

- Abraham's children through Keturah were loved and cared for but were sent away to ensure the blessing of Isaac (Gen. 17:18-19; Rom. 9:7; Heb. 11:18).
- The *toledot* or "generations" of Ishmael demonstrate God to be true to his promise. Ishmael, the son of Abraham, would also father twelve princes (Gen. 17:20-21).
- We must guard the trust given to us, and pass our blessings on to the next generation (Deut. 6:6-8; Ps. 34:11; 2 Tim. 2:1-2).

## II. SERVING OUR PURPOSE (VSS. 7-11)

- Both Abraham and Ishmael lived long lives. They served their purpose, and then they died. So will we (Gen. 25:7, 17; Acts 2:29).
- We must work while it is light. We do not know how many years we will have as Christ-followers, but we have work to do each day (John 9:4; Phil. 1:20-25; 2 Peter 1:12-15).
- Working hard in the kingdom of God does not always mean making big waves in this life (1 Tim. 2:1-3).
- When all is over in this life for us, Jesus has told us what we should hope to be able to say (Luke 17:7-10).

**KNOW**: Abraham lived 175 years, served his purpose in his generation, and then was "gathered to his people." We are pilgrims passing through this life. We must be purposeful about it.

**DO**: Serve your purpose in your generation faithfully.
