Dreamer: The Life of Joseph A Study in Genesis 37-50

Joseph's Integrity Genesis 39:1-23 June 13, 2021

"How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" And as she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not listen to her, to lie beside her or be with her. -Genesis 39:9-10

I. THE LORD WAS WITH JOSEPH

- Where the Lord's blessing is absent from Joseph's brothers, it is present with him (Gen. 39:2, 3, 21, 23).
- Even in dire circumstances Joseph works hard, acting on his blessings and finding favor wherever he goes (Gen. 39:3-6, 9, 22-23).
- In hindsight we now can see—all things are working toward Joseph's good (Gen. 50:2; Rom. 8:28).

II. FLEEING TEMPTATION

- Joseph's temptation was real, present, and virtually unavoidable. It would have served him well to acquiesce. Nevertheless, he resisted (Gen. 39:6-10; James 4:7-8).
- Joseph refused not only to sleep with his master's wife, but to even engage in pre-sexual activity (Gen. 39:10).
- When the temptation turned to a physical confrontation, Joseph chose to flee (Gen. 39:12; 1 Cor. 6:18-20, 10:12-13).
- Joseph's integrity brought upon him a false accusation of attempted rape, loss of position and privilege, his master's wrath, and prison. Nevertheless, it was the right thing to do.
- Confined to prison, Joseph rises to prominence. You can't keep a good man down (Gen. 39:20-23).

III. WE GET WHAT WE NEED

- Life is hard at times, temptations are real, but God gives us all we need (2 Peter 1:3-8).
- The mystery of godliness has been solved (1 Tim. 3:16).

KNOW: Temptation comes in many subtle ways. Sometimes, however, it is overtly obvious. Either way, believers are equipped to overcome it. We win the battle against temptation with better promises.

DO: Fight fire with fire. God offers better promises.
