Dreamer: The Life of Joseph A Study in Genesis 37-50

A Final Test Genesis 44:1-34 July 25, 2021

Now therefore, please let your servant remain instead of the boy as a servant to my lord, and let the boy go back with his brothers. - Genesis 44:33

I. A BRUTAL TEST

- This final test that Joseph enacts is painful for everyone involved, including Joseph (Gen. 44:13, 45:1-2).
- The test, however, demonstrates to Joseph that genuine repentance has taken place in his brothers' lives.
 - *Joseph's brothers "tore their clothes," as their father had done before them (Gen. 44:13 cf. 37:34).
- Joseph can see with his own eyes and hear with his own ears the change in his brothers. Particularly the change in Judah.

II. A BROTHER INTERCEDES

- Judah, now the de-facto leader of the family, speaks on behalf of the brothers (Gen. 44:18-34).
- Although they have clearly been set-up, the brothers attribute their circumstances to their own guilt before God (Gen. 44:16).
- Judah's plea, and offer of substitution, demonstrates clearly that changed hearts do indeed make changed lives (Gen. 37:26-27 cf. 44:18-34).

III. A PERFECT SUBSTITUTE

- Judah makes the final, dramatic step of offering himself as a substitute for his brother. An offer a distant descendent (Jesus) would make and fulfill on our behalf (2 Cor. 5:21; 1 Peter 2:24-25).
- Jesus took our place, the righteous for the unrighteous (Isa. 53:4-5; Gal. 3:13; 1 Peter 3:18).

KNOW: God has made those in Christ a new creation. The old has gone, the new has come. The substitutionary sacrifice of Christ has purchased our freedom from sin and has made us alive in Christ.

DO: Accept the sacrifice of Christ, be transformed...then repent.
