Dreamer: The Life of Joseph A Study in Genesis 37-50

Jacob's Blessing Genesis 49:1-33 September 5, 2021

Then Jacob called his sons and said, "Gather yourselves together, that I may tell you what shall happen to you in days to come." - Genesis 49:1

I. THE TWELVE TRIBES OF ISRAEL

- Jacob "walks through" his sons in birth order, sharing with them prophetic blessings concerning the future of their descendants (Gen. 49:1-27).
- Some of his prophecies are general concepts, some are very specific (Gen. 49:4, 7, 10, 13).
- The tribes of Judah and Joseph (Ephraim and Manasseh) receive the abundance of the blessing (Gen. 49:8-12, 22-26).
- Verse 18 is a wonderful interlude. Jacob pauses to exalt in his God.

II. GATHERED TO HIS PEOPLE

- Jacob dies at 147 years of age, but not before giving directions for his burial once again (Gen. 47:28, 49:28-33).
- With the death of Jacob the age of the patriarchs draws to a close. God is now the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Ex. 3:6; Matt. 8:5-13; Mark 12:24-27).

III. THE LION OF THE TRIBE OF JUDAH

- The most far reaching prophecy of Jacob lies with his son Judah. A line of kings will come from his body (Gen. 49:10; 1 Sam. 17:12).
- To one from the tribe of Judah shall come "the obedience of the peoples" (1 Cor. 15:24-28; Phil. 2:9-10).
- Eventually, the reign of King Jesus, "The Lion of the Tribe of Judah," will commence with great exaltation (Rev. 5:1-14).

KNOW: Jacob's deathbed blessing points to a coming ruler, revealed to us as Jesus the Messiah, who will reign forever and ever.

DO: Make peace with the Lion of the Tribe of Judah.
