Word Made Flesh

Prologue: In the Beginning John 1:1-5 November 28, 2021

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God.

- John 1:1-2

I. IN THE BEGINNING...LOGOS, THE WORD, GOD

- Now we know more about Genesis 1:1. The Triune God created the world (Gen. 1:1; Isa. 40:25-26; Col. 1:16).
- The deity of Christ cannot be described in any clearer language than this. The child in the manger is, was, and will forever be...God (Prov. 8:22-23, 27, 30-31; Col. 1:17; Heb. 1:5-12; 1 John 1:1-4).
- Creation was accomplished in Christ. Positively and negatively, all things came into being through him, and nothing came into being except through him (John 1:3; Col. 1:15-17).
- Logos is a Greek word that would have resonated with both Jews and Greeks.

II. LIFE AND LIGHT

- Life resides in Jesus. In fact, life is found only in Jesus (John 1:4, 14:6-7; Acts 4:12).
- We see everything in the light of Christ (Ps. 36:9; John 1:4; 2 Cor. 3:12-18; 4:4).

KNOW: God's eternal Word is the creative force behind our existence. In him is both life and light. Jesus is the God/Man. He is God.

DO: Find life in God's Eternal Word.
