THAT YOU MAY KNOW

Sons and Slaves John 8:31-47 July 24, 2022

I. THE CALL TO ABIDE (vv. 31-32)

- To abide is to persevere in trusting Christ's words (John 6:66-69).
- Jesus brings the freedom of the New Exodus (Is. 42:1-7;61:1).

II. "WE HAVE NEVER BEEN ENSLAVED!" (vv. 33-38)

- We are all slaves of sin by nature (Eph. 2:1-3).
- Slaves cannot remain in God's house; the Son must set you free (Eph. 2:4-10).
- True freedom is not freedom to sin, but freedom from sin (John 10:10; Rom. 6:20-23; Gal. 5:13).

III. "WE ARE SONS OF ABRAHAM!" (vv. 39-40)

 True sons of Abraham share the faith of Abraham (Gen. 15:6; Gal. 3:7-9, 29).

IV. "WE ARE SONS OF GOD!" (vv. 41-47)

- Those who abide in the truth love Jesus and are children of God (John 1:9-13; 3:1-8; 8:42).
- Those who reject the truth love lies and are children of the Devil (vv. 43-47; Gen. 3:1).

V. A WORD TO SONS AND SLAVES

- To sons:
 - 1. **Abide** in the words of Christ by faith resulting in obedience!
 - 2. Rejoice in the freedom you have in Christ!
- To slaves:
 - 1. Repent by turning from the sin that enslaves you!
 - 2. **Believe** by trusting in the Son of God who alone is able to set you free!

KNOW: You are either a free son of God, or a slave to sin; the seed of the woman and the seed of the serpent. The difference is revealed in whether you have put your faith and trust in Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

DO: To the sons, abide and rejoice in your freedom in Christ! To the slaves, repent and believe in the Truth that sets you free!
