THAT YOU MAY KNOW

A Commandment: Eternal Life John 12:44-50 January 15, 2023

And I know that his commandment is eternal life. - John 12:50

I. A FINAL APPEAL

- John's final recorded words of Jesus to the crowds are a cry to come to the light. Jesus (and John) desired the salvation of their hearers (Matt. 11:27-30; John 20:31).
- In Jesus, humankind meets God, and God meets humankind (John 10:30; 17:21).
- To believe in Jesus is, *ipso facto*, placing one's belief and hope in the Father. They are tied inextricably together (vss. 44-45).
- What is the cry of Jesus? Come to the light. Do not remain in the darkness (vs. 46).

II. THE WORKING WORD

- Jesus' task in his first Advent was not to pass judgment on people (vs. 47; John 3:17).
- Jesus' primary task in his second Advent will be to sum all things up, and to judge the world (Matt. 25:31-32; John 5:22, 27-30).
- Jesus came to save the world by sharing the gospel, and to allow that word of truth from the Father to save or condemn men and women (vs. 48; John 3:18-19).
- The word of God is a living word. It is an active word (Heb. 4:12 -13).
- The word Jesus speaks is the Father's word. That word is the word of life, and thus the Father's commandment to Jesus is the commandment of eternal life (vss. 49-50).

KNOW: Jesus came with a mandate from the Father. Preach words that lead to eternal life. The words are words of life. Follow them, and know life. Reject them, and reject life.

DO: Receive the words of Jesus. They lead to life.
